

#### **GOSPEL REFLECTION: Matthew 11:2-11**

John is in prison and has heard about Jesus. No doubt he has heard of both negative and positive reactions to Jesus, and he can identify with these differing reactions.

All Jesus is saying is that the job of the Messiah is to bring relief to the suffering and to introduce to ordinary people the Good News of how to walk in the way of the Lord.

John's people go back and report to John what they have seen and heard. Then Jesus turns to the crowd and offers them one of the choicest pieces of inspired poetry that we have about John. The first thing to notice is how Jesus immediately creates connection with the people by putting a question to them.

His first metaphor is the reed shaken in the wind that doesn't have any locomotion of its own. It moves whichever way the wind is blowing. It represents humans without a backbone, who lack purpose and principle. They may simply go with the power and follow the money. But John is not one of these spineless jellies.

Did you see in John a man clothed in expensive gear, out to spend money on himself and forget about everyone else? But such people are in royal houses and don't even know or care how the other half lives. Then Jesus ends with the classical third, that zeroes in on the right answer. You went out looking for a prophet. But here's the clincher, there are prophets who are models of authenticity, conviction and courage and then there are pseudo-prophets who are for sale, crawling to the highest bidder. According to Jesus, John outshines the lot.

Jesus tells us what He really thinks of John. There is no one greater than John. It is interesting that John has become associated with, and known by his ritual washing or plunging of people in the Jordan that symbolised their readiness to change, to turn back to God with all their heart.
