GOSPEL REFLECTION: John 18:33-37

This reading from the gospel of John is a departure from the round of gospel texts from Mark that are used for Year B. This is because it fits very well with the theme of Christ's Kingship. The scene is the trial of Jesus before Pilate where Jesus is facing the trumped up charge of claiming to be a King. The supposed crime here is that He is guilty of setting Himself up in opposition to the Roman emperor, Tiberius at the time. This was a capital offence requiring execution. Pilate was aware that the Jewish leaders had used this fake charge knowing that Pilate would dismiss a lesser charge that was motivated by religious politics. In any event, Pilate knew that the accusers simply wanted Jesus eliminated.

When Jesus asks if Pilate had heard from others that He was claiming to be a King, Pilate answers, 'Am I a Jew?' which was his way of distancing himself from the Jewish leadership that had brought the charge. This raises the issue around the use of the term 'the Jews' in the Fourth Gospel. A careful reading of John reveals that it applies to those of the Jewish leadership who were hostile to Jesus. It does not refer to all of the Jews in the time of Jesus and certainly does not apply to all Jews in general. Jesus points out to Pilate that His Kingdom is not of this world, that is, it comes from God. In fact, it is both a this-world reality as well as a spiritual phenomenon. It cannot be thought of as a kingdom with a king, administrators, and loyal subjects. If He were a King in the normal human way, Jesus says, His servants would certainly have risen up to defend Him. Jesus is on a different plane altogether and He knows Pilate is not in the race to understand Him.

We could use a variety of words to paint a picture of what we might mean by the Kingdom of God such as, the realm or world of God, the family, community or society of God, it really comes down to a way of living that ties us to God and each other. If we are part of this society of God we will live by the values Jesus recommends. The focus is not so much on our beliefs as on our praxis, our behaviour in relationship with others.
