

#### **GOSPEL REFLECTION: Luke 18:9-14**

We have to recognise that this parable is cleverly done. Let's look at a couple of smart moves Jesus makes in the telling. First, He is totally aware of His audience and their scale of values, priding themselves on being virtuous and yet passing judgment on others and looking down on them. Immediately we get the tone of this story and realise it is aimed at the self-righteous.

The characters, a Pharisee and a tax collector, are well chosen as social opposites. The Pharisee in a prayer pose was thanking God that he was not like the rest of humanity, swindlers, cheats, adulterers and more particularly not like this tax collector, who is nothing but a rip-off merchant. We realise at this point that the Pharisee was aware of the taxman nearby and was making comparisons. How shaky is the ground we stand on when we make comparisons!

Jesus paints a very different picture of the tax collector who stands apart and beats his breast. This was a traditional gesture of sorrow, despair or regret. Unlike the Pharisee he seems to have nothing to be proud of. He acknowledges that he is a sinner and in a mood of self-realisation he begs God for mercy. Unlike the Pharisee he is totally unaware of who else is His thought and prayer is just between himself and God. Jesus then drops a bomb on His listeners by telling them that the tax collector went home justified, that is, in God's favour. audience would not have expected this outcome and so His conclusion would have given them something serious to think about. There is a powerful message here about the importance of having a realistic image of ourselves. - Laurie Woods


