GOSPEL REFLECTION: Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

This passage follows Luke's short account of would-be followers of Jesus who appear to be half-hearted in that they had not fully counted the cost of discipleship. By contrast Luke now describes Jesus sending out seventy of His disciples to different towns and villages in order to spread the Word of His message. The intention here is that the disciples will prepare the way for Jesus so that when He arrives in different villages people will have had some introduction to what He is about. Notice how concerned Jesus is that these disciples take due care and prepare themselves to meet unbelief and even opposition.

Some scholars have suggested that the disciples were sent out two-by-two in male-female pairs. Christian tradition has stuck closely to the notion of the disciples being only men, and just twelve for that matter. Luke, however, mentions the women followers of Jesus at the beginning of chapter 8, so it is worth remembering that women played a significant part in the life and mission of Jesus. They were part of His band of followers, they were at the cross looking on from afar, they were at Pentecost and there is no reason to suppose they were not present at the Last Supper, which has always been celebrated as a family meal involving men, women and children. Whatever the case, Luke is making it clear to his community that the task of mission was not confined to the Twelve.
