GOSPEL REFLECTION: Luke 5:1-11

Luke is describing here another scene in the Galilean ministry of Jesus. He often mentions the crowds that followed Jesus as a way of emphasising how people were receiving His message and were hungry for more. The gospel writers make the point that not only did Jesus speak in a language that people could relate to but He lived out His own message in contrast to the religious teachers and the learned ones who were not known for practicing what they preached.

In this case Jesus is speaking to a gathering while standing on the shore of Lake Gennesaret, another name for the Sea of Galilee. Gennesaret was a town, a little southwest of Capernaum, on the northwest shore of the lake and was situated on a plain in this area. Jesus spots fishermen washing their nets and asks Simon if he could board one of the boats and be taken out a little from the shore. He shows a bit of savvy here appreciating that sound travels better over water and that His words would be carried more effectively if there were some distance between himself and the crowd. So he sits and addresses the crowd from the boat.

When He finished speaking Jesus asked Simon to pull out into deep water and pay out his nets for a catch. We know that Simon, the professional, offered some resistance saying that he and his team had worked all night and caught nothing, but acceding to the request of Jesus he put the nets out. The result of this action was a large, unexpected haul of fish that surprised the fishermen. Luke seems to suggest that the crowd had drifted off by this time.

Peter realised that Jesus was a charismatic individual and that he, a simple fisherman, was, in some mysterious way, in the presence of the Divine.
